Big Bad Voodoo Daddy will be starting our 18th season of the 2011-2012 Proudly Presenting Series in Civic Hall Performing Arts Center. The “Cast” of Beatlemania, The Texas Tenors’ Christmas, Rhythm of the Dance, and a ‘Surprise Reprise’ for the last production will be rounding out the Proudly Presenting Series of events for 2011-2012.

The season will open with **Big Bad Voodoo Daddy** and will be presented on Saturday, October 8, 2011 at 8:00pm. Since their arrival on the music scene in 1993, Big Bad Voodoo Daddy’s irresistible live show and aggressive, musically perceptive approach has proven them to be the singular standout among the numerous bands that launched the Nineties swing revival. The seven-man group forged a massively successful fusion of classic American sounds from jazz, swing, Dixieland, and big-band music, building their own songbook of original dance tunes. Big Bad Voodoo Daddy is a veteran force that to this day adds new fans by the roomful every time they play. Big Bad Voodoo Daddy now carries on the tradition of the legendary big bands and orchestras by touring non-stop, performing over 100 concerts each year around the world.

Our second show in the Series will be, **The “Cast” of Beatlemania**, presented on Saturday, November 5, 2011 at 8:00pm in Civic Hall. The Beatles music set the pop rock standard for most of the 1960’s. Now, in the 2000’s, The “Cast” of Beatlemania recalls the memories of that exciting era when the Fab Four ruled the world of rock ‘n’ roll. In the early 1960’s, The Beatles not only became a musical force but a sociological entity as well. Their hair, clothes and humor all contributed to their amazing impact. Probably

the most celebrated of rock groups, The Beatles dominated rock music from the early 1960's until they formally disbanded in 1970. The "Cast" of Beatlemania continue in their show as The Beatles changed in their careers. Three different costumes coincide with the changing music and times. The "Cast" recreates the sights and sounds of The Beatles so faithfully that you will recall when the world was engulfed in the most pleasant fever of all: BEATLEMANIA!

Scheduled for one performance on Saturday, December 10, 2011 at 8:00pm in Civic Hall will be **The Texas Tenors' Christmas Show**. The fourth performance for the Proudly Presenting Series is scheduled at 8:00pm on Saturday, March 17, 2012, with **Rhythm of the Dance**. This two-hour dance and music extravaganza contains a wealth of talent derived from all areas of Irish life, including three tenors and a full cast of dancers. The show is an inspiring epic, reliving the journey of the Irish Celts throughout history. Using the traditional and modern arts of dance (ballet, modern dance, jazz) and music, this richly costumed show marries the contemporary and the ancient. Combining traditional Irish dance and music with the most up to date stage execution, the show is a thousand year old story presented as a modern day stage show.
